Enhancing access and Connectivity: Key Construction Projects along the Treasure Coast Scenic Highway

Two major construction projects are currently underway along the Treasure Coast Scenic Highway. both aimed at improving safety, connectivity, and the overall visitor experience. The Fort Pierce North Bridge replacement project is looking to modernize aging infrastructure while maintaining access across the Indian River Lagoon. This effort is anticipated to be finished in Late 2027 and will result in a safer crossing for motorists, pedestrians and cyclists. Meanwhile, the Shared-Use Nonmotorized (SUN) trail extension through the Savannas Preserve State Park is bringing new opportunities for outdoor recreation and alternative transportation. Once completed this Fall, this trail segment will offer a scenic protected route for walkers, runners, and cyclists further enhancing the natural and cultural experiences along the scenic highway corridor. 
