Few people know the significance and beauty of Indian River Drive better than Diana Gregory, the dedicated Chairwoman of the Treasure Coast Scenic Highway Committee. Diana has been an active member of TCSHC since 2017. In this interview she shares her joy for stewardship and



her love for one of Florida's most picturesque corridors.

Tell us about yourself: I've lived in my home in Jensen Beach - Indian River Drive for 30 years. I retired from a career in nursing after 50 years and now enjoy volunteering for several non-profit organizations. Gardening, reading, and watching the birds keeps me happy.

Tell us about your experience volunteering with the Florida Scenic Highways Program? My experience with the program has allowed me to both contribute back to my community and to learn about the multiple entities that touch and influence our scenic highway.

What initially attracted you to the Indian River Lagoon - Treasure Coast Scenic Highway? I was initially invited to attend a scheduled meeting by a neighbor who had been involved with the program and have been coming back ever since.

What are the intrinsic qualities of your byway that make it unique? Historically, it is the same ribbon of road that was used to transport pineapples to be shipped from the port in Ft. Pierce in the early 1900's. There are no commercial distractions, only landscape and homes.




